Issue 4 of volume 75 (Fall 2011) was sent to Able Quality Printing and to EBSCO on November 2, and is on schedule for delivery to KLA members and subscribers on time (mid-November). The deadline for the first issue of volume 76 is December 15, 2011 with distribution planned for mid-February, 2012.

At the fall conference, three of the five board members who served during 2011—Robin Harris, Johan Koren and Katherine Pennavaria—met. [Prof. Dennis Carrigan retired from UK on June 30 and resigned from the board in the fall. A new board member will be named soon.] Discussion included the columns/departments, including the newest offering, “Genealogy Gems,” which debuted in the Fall 2010 issue, as a result of the 2010 board meeting. The column was deemed a success. Thanks to Katherine Pennavaria of Western Kentucky University for the idea and for writing the first column, and for overseeing other “Gems” submissions. Also at the conference, John Schlipp from NKU’s Stealy Library won the *Kentucky Libraries* Award for his article “Creative Thinking: A Student-Centered Approach to Plagiarism and Copyright” from the Summer 2010 issue (vol. 74, no. 3).
