

The Summer issue of volume 76 (no. 3) was distributed on schedule. The following schedule indicates submission deadlines and distribution dates:

December 15 for the Winter Issue (#1), published in mid-February
March 15 for the Spring Issue (#2), published in mid-May
June 15 for the Summer Issue (#3), published in mid-August
September 15 for the Fall Issue (#4), published in mid-November

Issue 4 of Volume 76 (Fall 2012) will be dedicated to health sciences libraries; all of the feature articles in the issue will deal with health sciences libraries. The editorial board wanted to try doing a themed issue; we found out that the program for the November 2012 meeting of the Kentucky Medical Library Association (KMLA) would be a panel presentation on the history of medical libraries in Kentucky, so we decided the Fall issue would be a good time to pursue the themed issue idea. The Fall issue is scheduled for publication in mid-November.

At the KLA Awards Luncheon on Thursday, September 20, the *Kentucky Libraries Award* for Volume 75 (2011) will be presented to Amanda Peach and Debra Tate from Kentucky State University for their article, "The Big Payback: Making a Case for Urban Lit in Kentucky's Libraries." The article appeared in the Summer 2011 issue (vol. 75 no. 3).
