Periodically we have a surge in commitments to our license plate project. The most recent has been from school librarians in Jefferson County. Clearly, some of our members are assisting in promoting this endeavor. We now have 231 commitments. In March we had 132. There will be a sign-up sheet at the conference registration desk. Our campaign is still many signatures short of the necessary 900, but interest is developing. Kentucky Friends of the Libraries is assisting us and we will promote it at the annual Kentucky Book Fair.

We had a great Legislative Day. We had a record number of delegates, 15 representing ALL types of libraries. Next year ALA is not sponsoring a Legislative Day in May; there will be a day during annual conference. This year's delegates agreed that we should send a Kentucky delegation nonetheless. At the December meeting I will ask the board to endorse this to the four sections.

I submitted several articles for *IN-FO-CUS* and two "Spotlight" features to *Kentucky Libraries*. Another on Kentucky's centennial librarians will be in the next issue.

We had many great nominations for our annual awards. Thanks to all the Section Chairs and Chair-Elects for choosing great candidates for each award.

I continue to look for ways to promote libraries and more importantly, librarians. Please let me know of any accomplishment or recognition you or others attain.
